

JUNE 2024 **HIGHLIGHTS**

Nationally year over year, the median single-family home sales price and the median condo sales price were up 4.1% and 2.6%, respectively. In Atlanta, the median single family home price was up 5.3% while condo sales price went down 4.8%


Across the nation the supply of listings for sale rose 23.4% year-over-year to the highest monthly count in almost 4 years. In Atlanta, the supply rose 70.5% which is the highest monthly count since 2019.

The number of sales declined 7.4% from May and 13.4% from June 2023 nationally. The number of sales in Atlanta rose 5.4% in May and declined 8.6% in June.

As of mid-July, 30 year conforming loan interest rates were the lowest since March, and June's inflation reading declined again, rekindling hopes the Fed will soon begin to reduce its benchmark rate. Finding comprehensive homeowner's insurance coverage at an affordable cost has become deeply challenging in many regions.

"We're seeing a slow shift from a seller's market to a buyer's market," NAR Chief Economist Lawrence Yun said, regarding national dynamics. "Homes are sitting on the market a bit longer, and sellers are receiving fewer offers (with more contingencies), and inventory is definitely rising."

Eastern Redbud


(Cercis canadensis): Small to mediumsized tree with heart-shaped leaves and delicate pink spring flowers, ideal for smaller yards or as an understory tree.

FIG SALAD

with blue cheese & prosciutto

Ingredients

2 oz. thinly sliced prosciutto

1½ lb. fresh figs, halved lengthwise (about 6 cups), divided

¼ cup extra-virgin olive oil

3 Tbsp. balsamic vinegar

1 Tbsp. minced shallot

1 tsp. kosher salt

½ tsp. black pepper, plus more for serving

6 oz. blue cheese, crumbled into large pieces

½ cup loosely packed fresh basil leaves

Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 375°F. Line a large rimmed baking sheet with parchment paper. Place prosciutto in a single layer on baking sheet. Bake in preheated oven until rendered and crisp, 12 to 14 minutes. Transfer to a paper towel-lined plate, and let cool, about 10 minutes. Break into 2-inch pieces.
- 2. Mash 2 large fig halves with a fork in a small bowl to equal about 2 tablespoons. Whisk in oil, vinegar, shallot, salt, and pepper until combined; set vinaigrette aside.
- 3. Arrange cheese, basil, crispy prosciutto, and remaining fig halves on a large platter. Sprinkle with additional black pepper, and drizzle with vinaigrette just before serving.
