They're my built-in walking buddies, and together we're always on the lookout for the next great doggy hotspot. From shady neighborhood gems to lively social parks, exploring Atlanta through their wagging tails has become one of my favorite ways to discover the city.

Here are my picks for the best dog parks inside the Perimeter (ITP) Atlanta:

Piedmont Park Dog Park (Midtown)

A beloved urban oasis featuring 3 acres of off-leash space divided into areas for large and small dogs. Amenities include shaded seating, water spigots, restrooms, and weekend concessions like King of Pops dog popsicles. Centrally located and ideal for combining with a stroll, skyline views, or a visit to the main park.

Freedom Barkway Dog Park (Old Fourth Ward)

A vibrant 2-acre community-driven space, with separate zones for large and small pups, agility features, benches, and water stations. Right on the BeltLine, it's perfect for pairing a bike or walk with playtime.

Fetch Park (Old Fourth Ward / Inman Park area)

Atlanta's first full-service dog-park bar: turf play areas, dog wash stations, Wi-Fi, TVs, food and drink options, and on-site supervision. Membership or day pass required, with proof of vaccinations. Offers a social destination where both dogs and owners can relax and mingle.

Skyland Dog Park (Brookhaven)

Nestled off Buford Highway with separate large and small dog areas, water fountains, and ample space. Located inside the larger Skyland Park complex that includes walking trails, volleyball courts, and family-friendly amenities.

Ormewood Dog Yard (East Atlanta)

A volunteer-run, neighborhood dog park with a welcoming, local vibe. It's a modest but beloved space where pups can run free and owners can mingle—no frills, just a friendly atmosphere.

Atlantic Station Dog Park (Midtown edge)

Centrally located right in Atlantic Station, this open-air park features turf and dirt sections, benches, trees, and enough room for pups to play with plenty of shade. Convenient for residents or shoppers in the area to stop by.

Mozley Dog Park (Westside)

A recent addition—a one-acre off-leash space in Mozley Park that includes agility climbers for big dogs and tunnels for smaller ones. A great new option for In-town Westside residents.

Renaissance Park Dog Park (Midtown)

A tucked-away, hillside retreat offering quiet, wooded ambience with skyline views. Fenced, tranquil, and a nice escape from busier city dog parks.
