Matthijs further fueled the Garamond revival. Today, Garamond remains a symbol of enduring elegance and readability, leaving its indelible mark not only in print, with a presence in literary classics like Dr. Seuss and the entire Harry Potter series, but also in corporate visuals, including the iconic logos of Google, Abercrombie & Fitch, and Apple's legendary "Think Different" campaign.

Final Concept: Rags to Riches





Still contemplating color pallet, thoughts on going from parchment paper to white paper.


